



ASISA ACADEMY NEWSFLASH - MAY 2023

Dear Stakeholder

One month to go before we welcome the 13th intake of TSiBA Business School students to the ASISA Academy <u>IMACS@TSiBA Internship</u>, and we are excited to unveil the new structure, which will allow us to scale this internship significantly. TSiBA is a Cape Townbased not-for-profit higher education institution, and this internship is our longest-standing graduate programme.

Previously, participating ASISA member companies would be required to commit to sponsoring one or two undergraduate TSiBA students completing a Bachelor in Business Administration (BBA) Finance degree to participate in the ASISA Academy's investment management administration programme. On successful completion of the programme, the students would then intern at the same company for 16 weeks during their final year of study. As a result of sponsors having to commit to hosting their selected interns from the outset, only a small group of students would get the opportunity to enrol in the investment management administration programme.

We therefore revised our approach, with the aim of making it possible for all TSiBA BBA Finance students interested in investment management administration to enrol in the IMACS@TSiBA Internship. ASISA members can now opt to sponsor students' participation in the academic component only. Alternatively, a sponsor can fund a group of students for the academic portion and then select only one or two for the internship, which runs from August to November in the student's final year of study. Students not selected for internships by ASISA members will be assisted by TSiBA to find internships elsewhere.

With this approach, we hope to secure funding for the delivery of the academic component of the programme to all TSiBA students who elected to add the investment management administration component to their degree, starting in July 2023. The cost of funding the academic component for one student is R17 500 (excl VAT). This programme aligns with categories B & D on the Learning Programme Matrix.

NEWS FROM OUR GRADUATE PROGRAMMES

IFA Internship

The ASISA Academy <u>Independent Financial Advisor (IFA) Internship</u> was launched in 2016 and has proven highly effective in helping Black graduates bridge the gap between tertiary education and the skills required by IFA practices.

To date, 221 graduates have participated in the IFA Internship. On average, around 85% receive offers of permanent employment from their host practices on completion of their internships. We are also pleased that at least 60% of interns every year have been female, with the 2023/24 intake being 70% female.

The eighth IFA Internship is currently underway, with 31 interns participating.

The Academy will circulate a communication shortly about the opening of the application window for IFA host practices who wish to host an intern in 2024. Interested IFA practices are requested to click <u>here</u> to be added to this mailing list.

The young women participating in the <u>Fezeka</u> programme are in the fourth month of their first work rotation. The ASISA Academy team is gearing up to brief the line managers at the companies hosting the second rotation. Over 15 months, the graduates will work at various host companies, while also participating in the ASISA Academy's <u>Financial Markets Practitioner Learnership</u>.

Fezeka is an exciting industry collaboration aimed at helping the South African asset management industry improve the representation of Black women on investment teams. The Fezeka Graduate Programme is delivered by the ASISA Academy and business consultancy Joint Prosperity.
