Growth and success can be measured in different ways. For the ASISA Academy, substantial growth in demand for our learning programmes is the most meaningful confirmation that our approach is working. When the growing demand comes from the same entity year after year, we are truly humbled.

In 2020, we were approached by the Office of the Auditor General for the first time with a request to deliver five bespoke online workshops to 85 delegates. We have been delivering bespoke online workshops to employees of the Office of the Auditor General every year since then. In March this year, another 285 delegates attended six bespoke online workshops.

This means that over the past four years, 633 employees from the Office of the Auditor General unpacked the following topics with us: Asset Management, Local and International Bonds, Investment Management, Infrastructure Investing, Private Equity, Introduction to Banking and Financial Services as well as Local and International Economics.

We thank the Office of the Auditor General for this significant vote of confidence and for partnering with us to provide a learning path for their employees.

NEWS FROM OUR GRADUATE PROGRAMME

Financial Markets Practitioner Learnership

The ASISA Academy's pilot <u>Financial Markets Practitioner (FMP) Learnership</u> concluded at the end of February 2023. This was a proud moment for the members of the ASISA Academy, who had dedicated several years to achieving institutional accreditation with the Quality Council for Trades and Occupations (QCTO) and revising this qualification specifically for the investment management industry. A feather in our cap was receiving the highest rating across all eight monitoring areas for the first iteration of the learnership from the QCTO verifier.

Delegates declared competent will write the external examination set by the South African Institute of Stockbrokers (SAIS) in April 2023.

The second iteration of the FMP Learnership kicked off on 7 March 2023. The eight female graduates participating in the Fezeka Graduate Programme are also participating in the current FMP Learnership.

Fezeka Graduate Programme

The young women participating in the <u>Fezeka programme</u> are in the second month of their first work rotation. They are adjusting well to their new corporate environments at their host employers. Over 15 months, the graduates will work at various host companies, while participating in the ASISA Academy's <u>FMP Learnership</u>.

Fezeka is an exciting new industry collaboration aimed at helping the South African asset management industry improve the representation of Black women on investment teams. The Fezeka Graduate Programme is delivered by the ASISA Academy and business consultancy Joint Prosperity.

RETIREMENT FUND TRUSTEE EDUCATION UPDATE

There was a strong demand for bespoke <u>Retirement Fund Trustee Education (RFTE)</u> workshops in March. We presented 16 workshops to more than 200 trustees and principal officers from the following retirement funds:
